We all have different colors and kinds of hair and different skin color. Some of us wear glasses and some of us don't.


What are some other ways we are the same and different?




Some kids are born with Autism. Kids who have Autism may learn or act a little different, but they still enjoy some of the same things we do.



How Our AMAZIMO Brains Work Every Day



































Children with Autism can also have special gifts:

- Some are still finding what they are really good at












As you can see, kids with Autism have their unique qualities, just like you and me!





Being a Friend and Kind to Someone with Autism

Just like any friend, it is nice to ask them about things that they are interested in.







You can be a friend to someone with Autism by being friendly.

Say "ne o" and invite new friends to play!







Sometimes, your friend with Autism might sit with you and play but not talk to you. You should know they still want to be your friend even if they don't use their words.

Be patient and try to remember what it is like for them.



If your friend is not sharing or taking turns, know that they are not trying to be mean. You could help them learn the rules.





Be understanding when one of their senses is overwhelming them.

If some noises may feel TOO LOUD for them. They may use headphones, cover their ears, or speak words to themselves to cover up the loud noise and feel more calm.
